JULY 17: Murder of Robert Lavender on Monroe Street and 7th Street.



WHAT WE DO NOW

Department of Public Safety

- 8-10 officers on duty, patrolling campus
- 24/7 coverage and dispatch center
- Rave alert system and Information Alerts
- Escort to locations on campus
- At least one armed DPS officer on every shift
- Most buildings adopting card access

WHAT WE DO NOW Additional Campus Support

Campus Facilities

- 115 blue light telephones and 44 panic buttons
- 600 security cameras (700% increase since 2021)
- Buildings have been assigned addresses for 911 calls

Education and Training

Emergency training drills and provide in-person and virtual training



Activity Since July 5th



Frequent Communication

8 updates to campus community and 40 responses to individual questions.

Increased Police Presence

Local police who have committed to increased police presence.

Safety Walk

40 members of our community walked campus to identify safety issues.

Meeting with Mayor Bowser

Met with Mayor Bowser to discuss concerns about the safety and security of our city.



Action Plan

GOALS

- Bring the community together to focus on safety.
- Identify places where we can improve security.
- Draw attention and awareness to safety and security issues.



ACTION PLAN Visibility on Perimeter

Increase DPS Visibility

- More officers on foot, vehicular, and bike patrols. More patrol cars.
- Increased presence along the perimeter of campus.

Hire Supplemental Security

- At entrance of Brookland-CUA Metro Station on John McCormack Road.
- Under the Taylor Street Bridge near the DuFour Athletic Center.



Department of Public Safety

Emergency Coordinator

- We will hire a full-time director for emergency services.
- The Coordinator will support ongoing training of community.

Arm DPS Officers

- There will be an armed DPS presence on every shift.
- Armed officers will be trained by August 1, 2023.

Enhanced Security Measures

Key Card Access/Panic Buttons: Electronic key card access points and panic buttons in key areas.

Security Cameras: 600 Security Cameras installed since 2021 (700% increase), and 97 to go).

Door Stoppers: Deploy solutions to block classroom doors during emergencies.

Further Study: Lighting around campus (Night walk). And expansion of Shuttle Service.

Community Engagement

City Leadership/Mayor Bowser

Discuss crime in the District, its impact, and the safety of our campus.

Metro Police Department

Increased patrols on McCormack Road/MPD representative to train new students at Freshman Orientation.

Metro Transit Police

Increased patrols/Address lighting issues at Metro stop/Community training.

Brookland Business Leaders

Working with business leaders to promote safety and security.




